

## Senate Floor Action for May 24, 2017

**Telecommunications Modernization (SB 1381):**

States that after July 1, 2017, a Large Electing Provider (AT&T) may cease to offer and provide traditional landline services to new and existing non-residential customers, upon 60 days' notice to the ICC and affected customers. They may also stop offering traditional landline services to new residential customers and existing customers, upon 90 days' notice to the ICC and affected customers.

**Small Wireless Facilities Deployment Act (SB**

**1451):** Creates the Small Wireless Facilities Deployment Act. Provides that units of local government shall not prohibit, regulate, or charge fees for the installation, mounting, maintaining, modifying, operating, or replacing of a small wireless facility on or next to a support structure or utility pole.

**Rolling Stock Sales Tax Exemption (SB 1871):**

Changes the various Use and Excise Tax Acts to make changes to the rolling stock exemption beginning July 1, 2017.

**Conor's Law (SB 2185):** Creates a police "protective custody" for drunk drivers who are younger than age 21. Whenever a person younger than age 21 is arrested for DUI and still appears intoxicated at the police station, the police officer must make a reasonable attempt to contact a responsible adult who is willing to take custody of the intoxicated individual. If a responsible adult is not available or is unwilling to take custody of the individual, the individual shall be offered the opportunity to take a breathalyzer or chemical test to prove that he or she is sober before being released.
